



Getting Here

- Tamarack, Idaho is located in the Payette River Mountains area—90 miles north of Boise, 17 miles south of the resort town of McCall, west of the small town of Donnelly, on the northwest shores of Lake Cascade.
- State Route 55, the Payette River Scenic Byway, provides year-round access to the Resort site from Boise. Travel time from Boise to the resort via State Highway 55 is approximately two hours.
- The Boise Airport (BOI) provides direct flights from 24 regional and major U.S. airports.
- Out-of-state visitors to Tamarack Resort can take direct flights to Boise from regional and major cities, including: Atlanta, Bozeman, Chicago, Denver, Las Vegas, Los Angeles, Minneapolis, Missoula, Oakland, Phoenix, Portland, Reno, Sacramento, Salt Lake City, San Diego, San Francisco, San Jose, Seattle, and Spokane.
- Air carriers that serve the Boise Airport include Alaska Airlines, Big Sky, Delta, ExpressJet, Frontier, Horizon Air, Northwest, SkyWest, Southwest, United, and US Airways.
- After landing at BOI, passengers have three transportation options:
 - 1) Direct shuttle service. For reservations call **877.TAM RESORT**
 - 2) Convenient air-taxi to McCall's regional airport
 - 3) Personal rental car for a scenic drive up SH55.
- The McCall Airport has a 6,100-foot lighted airstrip suitable for a full range of private jets and small commercial aircraft.
- Tamarack Resort and regional developers are actively lobbying to get commercial air service into the McCall Airport. The McCall City Council recently adopted the Revised Master Plan for the Airport, which will allow for the expansion of the airport runway and enhancement of safety areas associated with the requirements for commercial air service to be viable. Once those improvements are made, expected to occur over the next three years, then there is an option for commercial air service into McCall.
