

- **Mountain Biking:** Tamarack Resort has the region's only full-service trail park, designed by experts of the International Mountain Biking Association (IMBA). The park features more than 36 miles of lift-served downhill and foothills trails designed for all riding abilities, with access to endless miles of forest-service trails.
 - 16 miles of downhill single-track
 - 20 miles of single- and double-track foothills cross-country trails
 - Challenge Park offering skill-testing teeter-totters, rocks, and other obstacles.
 - Jump Park featuring multiple ramp jumps for all ages and skill levels.
 - Kona Groove Approved Bike Park
 - Base of IMBA's Payette River Mountains 'Learn to Ride Center'
- **Zipline Tours:** Idaho's first Zipline Tour - a high-flying adrenaline adventure which provides a bird's eye view of the surrounding mountains, meadows, lakes and forest. Guests glide along at upwards of 30 miles per hour on cables on up to eight separate ziplines ranging in length from 75 to 875 feet long and up to 200 feet above the ground.
- **Lake Cascade:** The large body of water is 21 miles long by 4-1/2 miles wide and is ideal for swimming, sailing, fishing, canoeing, lake kayaking, power boating, waterskiing and wakeboarding. The north end of the lake near Tamarack breaks into four forest-lined channels, providing an intimate setting for bird watching and scenic outings. The lake warms to 72 degrees in the summer.
- **Lakefront Activities:** A boat fleet is available for rental and guided tours and includes pontoon boats, catamarans, sail boats, aluminum fishing boats, ski boats, and flat-water kayaks. Guided and instructional services include waterskiing, wakeboarding, sailing, kayaking, and fishing. Tamarack is developing a Lakefront Park and Marina which will feature a restaurant, store, boat slips, on-water boat-fueling, and a sandy beach and swimming area. Completion is anticipated for summer 2009.
- **Wildlife:** Three designated bird sanctuaries line Lake Cascade, providing superb wildlife viewing opportunities of tundra swans, loons, sandhill cranes, white pelicans, Western grebes, bald eagles, ospreys, and a diverse population of ducks. Fish which call the local waters home include rainbow trout, Coho salmon, small mouth bass, bullhead catfish, channel catfish, crappie, and perch.
- **Whitewater Rafting:** Tamarack's Payette River Guides provide whitewater rafting and fly-fishing adventures on the 10-mile Cabarton section of the Payette River, 1/2 hour drive from Tamarack.
- **Guided Services:** A special-use permit from the Boise and Payette National Forests allows the resort to offer private and group guided hiking and biking trips on more than 80 miles of little-known roads and trails on the backside of West Mountain and Council Mountain.
- **Tamarack Kids' Camp:** Tamarack Kids' Summer Camp is a great introduction to all of the fun-filled recreational opportunities at Tamarack. Some activities include nature tours, whitewater rafting, sailing, and golf clinics, to name a few.
