A SEASON OF MOMENTUM AT TAMARACK RESORT


New recreation amenities and capital investments highlight summer updates

TAMARACK, Idaho (May 23, 2022) —It is a summer of momentum at Tamarack as the resort opens additional trails, offers new amenities and expands its recreation fleet while continuing to invest millions into building out the destination's master plan.

Bike & Hike

For those seeking vertical, there will be new options to summit and descend the mountain as part of a long-term expansion of the <u>Tamarack trail system</u>. This summer brings the opening of two new intermediate mountain biking flow trails – Skypilot and Hot Shot – and a loop trail to ascend the summit. Tamarack's first multiuse, multi-directional climbing trail also debuts this summer, allowing guests to hike, bike or e-bike from the base to mid-mountain and connect into the loop trail through the iconic tamarack grove.

"Our talented Tamarack Bike Park team has been working for over a year in challenging weather conditions on these new trails to ensure they're high-quality and sustainable," said Tamarack VP of Operations Wolfe



Ashcraft. "As we expand our trail system, we focus on how to provide a variety of experiences for all levels of hikers and riders across the mountain and meadow."

Tamarack Outfitters is adding to its <u>rental fleet</u> with the addition of Knolly full-suspension bikes, e-bikes, new Jamis and Kona cross country bikes and kids' lift-served bikes. Getting gear onto the mountain will be easier with the addition of self-loading bike trays on Tamarack Express that allow for e-bike access to the downhill trails.

The premier downhill mountain bike series in the West, the NW Cup, returns to Tamarack for its fifth year, June 24-26, when hundreds of riders gather to show off their skills and speed.

Waterfront

Guests can invite a few more friends along for a day on the lake thanks to Tamarack's expanded fleet of watercraft on Lake Cascade. In addition to more pontoon boats and new Jet Skis, the <u>waterfront cabana</u> and marina will offer three new surf boats for rental, including the 2022 Malibu M220. Tamarack is also expanding its successful winter Trailblazers program with weekly watersports experiences for kids.

Guided Experiences

Whether equipped with an ax, an oar, a rod or a carabiner and harness, the adventurous now have more guided excursions to consider. Reservations are open for <u>zipline tours</u> on West Mountain, new <u>guided fishing experiences</u> on Lake Cascade, <u>whitewater rafting</u> on the Cabarton stretch of the Payette River and ax throwing in The Village.

Zipline, waterfront and whitewater activities open Memorial Day weekend, depending on the weather. Lift service will operate seven days a week from June 17 to August 21.

Golf

Work is underway to restore and reopen the award-winning Osprey Meadows championship golf course. Later this summer, eager golfers can start imagining their next round while practicing on the restored driving range. For more information, visit the new Osprey Meadows Championship Golf Course.

Experiences & Events

Adventures will begin and be celebrated afterward in The Village. <u>Tamarack Outfitters</u> is the one-stop shop for tickets, lessons, maps, gear and tune-ups. Steps away, you will find all the fuel needed at Clearwater Coffee, the Market, The Reserve and Rendezvous Food Hall. The plaza will come alive with live music three nights a week along with some of the best views of fireworks on Memorial Day and Fourth of July weekends.

Tamarack's popular Mid-Mountain Meteor Shower viewing party returns July 26, as does Bikes, Brews and Bluegrass on September 4. For additional summer events, visit the resort's <u>event calendar</u>.

Master Plan

Guests will notice construction activity across the base area, on the mountain and along the meadow as Tamarack continues its planned growth.

"This summer, our goal is to have as little impact on the near-term guest experience as possible while upgrading the overall long-term experience through our capital investments," said Tamarack President Scott Turlington

On the mountain, work is underway to install new snowmaking pipe to expand coverage and four new state-of-the-art automated snow guns for more efficient and effective snowmaking. Additionally, the base area is being regraded for easier access between The Village and the lifts.

Tamarack is also building out its community by breaking ground on Lakeview Village along its West Mountain Road border. Lakeview Village is the location of the new employee housing complex, the Mountain Community School and a new Donnelly Fire Department substation. These facilities are anticipated to be complete and operational by this fall.
