- Lumberjack Land—an interactive, family-friendly zone located off the Waltz run.

Snowmaking

- A 30% increase in coverage across 150 acres of named runs—with the majority of them
 accessible from the Tamarack Express lift—thanks to six new automated snow guns (TA
 TT10—the most efficient in the world) and one mile of new snowmaking pipe.
- Improved grooming of steeper terrain with upgraded snowcat technology (Prinoth Winch Cat and additional Winch Cat pick points).

Nordic Center

• The Nordic Center is in The Lodge at Osprey Meadows—at the foot of the Nordic trail system—and offers retail, rentals and lessons. The trail system is dog-friendly and suitable for cross-country and skate skiing as well as snowshoeing and fat biking.

Guest Experience

- A newly installed automated ticket/pass kiosk, located on The Village Plaza, lets skiers and boarders skip the ticket line and print a ticket or reload a pass and then head straight to the lift.
- More ticket options, including the 4Fun Pass and multiday, consecutive-day tickets.
- Online reservations are now available for rental equipment.
- Paid overnight RV camping in the resort's lower Aspen Parking Lot.

Skiing & Snowboarding

Tamarack Resort offers 1,530 acres of skiable terrain. Discover 50 named runs featuring everything from open bowls, steeps, cornices and high-speed corduroy groomers to six named glades, natural tree-skiing areas, challenging backcountry and three terrain parks. The primarily east-facing slopes receive an average of 300 inches of snowfall and are served by seven lifts, including three high-speed quads, two fixed-grip quads and two surface lifts.

Nordic Skiing, Snowshoeing & Fat Biking

Tamarack's Nordic trail system features more than 25 kilometers (15+ miles) of paths for classic or skate skis, snowshoes or fat bikes to wind through open meadows and woodlands while enjoying mountain-high views in every direction. The dog-friendly trails are groomed daily and are open every day from dawn to dusk.

Sports School

The resort's certified instructors and coaches offer daily first-timer, private and semi-private lessons for all ages and abilities as well as camps and clinics for all experience levels.

Guided Ice Fishing

Guided ice-fishing adventures are available on nearby Lake Cascade, where anglers can fish for jumbo perch, bass, rainbow trout and other species. Trips include guides, gear, bait and an ice shack. Snowmobiles are available for an additional cost.
